President's Christmas Message



Dear Surrey WC members,

As we say Goodbye to 2023 the club can reflect on its efforts to support and encourage race walking at a difficult time in its long history as an athletic discipline.

The introduction of a new Winter League (4 races spread over an equal number of months and at different venues) named the Ray Hall Memorial League has taken off and the club hosted the second race at Tonbridge track. A good turnout especially by younger walkers from Lewes AC, Ashford AC and Blackheath and Bromley Harriers AC ensued a successful event, as was the third on 9th December at Lewes. The work of our coaches Peter Selby and Shaun Lightman is greatly valued. Club participation in national and regional championships is virtually non-existent although a few of our more active walkers support local races, including the VAC's Summer league of 5m and 5k races. Nevertheless, the club completed a full programme which we use as taster and development events to introduce people to walking. This is in support of the initiative begun by Mark Easton, who is currently chair of the RWA (Southern Area), and set up a small working group to establish a long-term strategy to promote race walking. Its work continues.

On the Strollers front we are very pleased that Samantha (Clark) has kindly taken on the Coordinator's role and she has successfully attracted a number of participants to the strolls held this Autumn, and it is hoped that more will be willing to act as leaders once the weather improves. Strolls have been such an integral part of the club that we need to ensure they continue and are enjoyed. It is hoped to hold a President's stroll in the Spring.

2024 is a year to be celebrated by the club: its 125th anniversary. A small group is being formed led by Trevor Sliwerski, our social secretary, to identify a convenient and appropriate venue for a dinner, and to assess numbers and cost. It should be a great occasion and will be held as near as possible to the date of the club's formation in 1899. Additionally, we have a number who have completed 50 years membership and we will mark their extraordinary time with the club at an appropriate function. We hope to reintroduce a Gazette Night.

The club has always supported The Centurions. Many SWC walkers have successfully qualified for membership of the Centurions and the club's history of ultra distance walking is a proud and distinguished one. It is hoped the club will be involved in the organisation of the 100th 100 miles in 24 Hours to be held in 2025.

Our thanks for the successful running of the club go to many who volunteer their time, and especially to Peter Hannell, our indefatigable Secretary, and Pam (Ficken) for keeping tabs on our membership, and our Captain Nolan Simmons.

I wish all club members a Very Merry Christmas and Happy and successful New Year.

race round up June - December 2023

Blackheath & Bromley HAC Johnson Bowl 4 miles incorporating Surrey Walking Club 4 miles 28 June 2023

A good total of 13 turned out for this annual event, which over a number of courses and distances has been held for well over 100 years – perhaps among the longest running athletic events in the country. As has often happened the weather was kind giving us a pleasant evening in the park.

Jonathan Ellerton from BBHAC just managed to catch and pass Loughton's Melanie Peddle in the last few yards after Melanie had recovered a significant deficit by the 3 mile point. Both were close to the top in terms of comparative performance although the best came from Jonathan's father down in 5th place. Jonathan thus retained the Johnson Bowl.

Another good performance came from David Hoben who won the Surrey Walking Club Handicap. The SWC Championship went to Ian Statter who, in spite of little training, walked faster than predicted. David's repeated rival in recent races, Chris Flint (SWC President), was a little off peak to produce a gap of nearly two minutes or twice the usual close competition. It was good to see SWC's Mick Harrran (M80) also out for the first time after a long gap. Although understandably below his usual high standard, he was well inside 4 mph. Veterans AC 5k Road Walk - Battersea Park, 1 August 2023

The last of the regular Battersea Park races had an average field this time in indifferent humid weather, luckily the rain held off for the duration.

Coming in as men's winner was Dave Annetts from N Herts RR in a fast time just outside his personal best, with Ian Richards from Steyning AC not far behind. The ladies' winner for the third time running was Melanie Peddle from Loughton AC, in her usual highly respectable time.

Veterans AC were pleased to welcome two guests from Hong Kong, Min Yee Michelle Lee and For Yau Fung who had chosen the race while holidaying in the UK.

In addition the other guests were Paul Hawkins from Stratford upon Avon AC, and promising junior athlete Trejan Checheku-Boamah from Blackheath & Bromley AC who completed in a good time; going under 30 minutes for this distance is now a realistic target for him.

Thanks to John Hall (Belgrave Hs.) a local resident, the Council had swept the course a couple of days previously and John was out sweeping the course of any conkers that had fallen since.

Past winner Adrian James was on hand and joined the friendly atmosphere at the presentation buffet where the prizes were handed out by Centurion Pam Ficken.
